Balgonie Elementary School Council (BESC)

The Balgonie Elementary School Council (BESC) has completed its first year replacing the local School Board and the Home and School Association (H&S Assoc.). The playground committee has become a sub-committee of the BESC. The BESC continues to provide services that the H&S Assoc. provided previously (i.e. funding some school trips, providing lunch and supervisory services for lunch hours, etc). We have spent the last year organizing the committee and establishing the roles and responsibilities of the council. We continue to provide funding to several services that were previously funded through the H&S Assoc. We have created a Constitution and are members of the Saskatchewan Association of School Councils.

The BESC is made up of 22 members that consist of a Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, Treasurer, 11 Members at Large, parent representatives from other schools including Edenwold, Kronau, and Muscowpetung(vacant), one parent representative from the community of Balgonie, two senior representatives from Balgonie Elementary School and one school administrator. Meetings are held the first Monday of each month from 7:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. Elections are conducted in September and are one year terms.

The BESC will be taking a break for the summer. The Executive members of the council will be meeting on Aug. 25, 2005 to finalize details for the AGM. The AGM will be on September 12, 2005.

Report from the RM of South Qu'Appelle

The regular Council meeting was held on June 3rd. One candidate for election in sub-division 7 of the new school district attended to discuss her reasons for seeking election and to hear concerns of councillors.

The owners of a lease on a substantial gravel deposit in the RM brought a proposal for the RM to purchase the lease. A verbal agreement was reached pending a test excavation on the site.

Information was received from SARM regarding the dates of the June district meetings; availability of the SARM history book; producer car loading manuals; the expected amendments to the Public Utilities Easements Act; Recommendations for minimum bridge rail heights; updates on the education tax issue and how Saskatchewan compares with neighbouring provinces. The average education tax on agricultural land in Saskatchewan is twice that paid by farmers in Manitoba and 2.5 times that in Alberta.

Also received were the minutes of the Hamlet of Edgeley board meeting, the McLean fire department budget and the minutes of the annual general meeting of the Southeast Regional Library.

The latest draft of the proposed zoning by-laws was distributed to councillors who will study this in preparation for the next meeting with the consultant. The administrator also presented an informational sheet outlining the time-lines for the implementation of the new Municipalities Act, and the obligations of RMs under this legislation.

Two development permits were approved, and one subdivision application was approved subject to conditions. Grants were approved to the town of Qu'Appelle and the village of McLean for the recycling bins. RM residents are reminded that they may use these bins.

Various items of correspondence received included the crop report, police reports, Qu'Appelle Valley School Division report and the ACRE final report.

Citizens on Patrol Program

What is a “Citizens on Patrol Program”?

The Citizens on Patrol Program (COPP) concept originated in Western Canada. Ordinary citizens supplement police patrols to help reduce crime by keeping a neighbourly watch over their communities. Patrols watch for any unusual and/or criminal activity, and report such incidents to the police for any necessary follow-up. Citizens on Patrol have neither the authority nor the mandate to make arrests, nor to take any action that might jeopardize their own safety or that of the public. The role of Citizens on Patrol is to simply observe and report.

Who can become involved?

The program is open to all community members who fill out an application (available at the Town Office) and meet the criteria on that application. No special knowledge is needed, just a willingness to serve your community.

Where will the Program be carried out?

The goal of this initiative would be to have this Program run in our town beginning this fall. There are already literally thousands of these Programs running successfully in communities all across Canada.

What would I be required to do?

Once we have enough trained volunteers (training to be provided by the RCMP) all that would be required would be that you take a regular shift about once a month to patrol around our town and watch for unusual, suspicious and/or criminal activity, and report that activity to the RCMP if you observe anything.



Why is this Program so effective?

Communities that have a **COPP** in place benefit from having increased surveillance in their community; something that the overtaxed police force cannot provide at the same level. Every community involved in this program across Canada reports reduction in property crime, theft and nuisance calls. Community members also report an increase in the feeling of security and well being in their communities.


How can we make this Program work in Balgonie?

Firstly, by filling out an application to join the program. The larger the number of volunteers, the more effective the program can be. Secondly, by encouraging your friends and neighbours to join also. Even if they don't at least they will know about the program and have a chance to support it in some way. Thirdly, by offering to bring leadership and direction to this program. While your **Community Justice Committee** fully supports this Program, we are not in the position to be able to organize and run it. There are a few of you though who could do this very well. If you recall the crime statistics we published last month you know that we could all benefit from having a **COPP** in Balgonie.

Let's join together to start making our community more secure. If you have any more questions about the **COPP** or if you are interested in helping to lead and organize the **COPP** contact our **Mayor, Tim Sterzer** or **Sgt. Tammy Patterson** of our local RCMP detachment.
